

Conflict Minerals Policy – UN Targets 1-12-17

Steel Products A/S is committed to responsible sourcing of steel products and takes responsibility for ensuring that the products and materials it uses are produced in a responsible, ethical and sustainable manner. We believe that our customers expect high-quality products that are produced in a socially and environmentally responsible manner, and we strive to meet those expectations. As part of our commitment to responsible sourcing, we have developed a policy that outlines our approach to sourcing steel products, with a particular focus on our efforts to avoid the use of conflict minerals.

Steel Products A/S is committed to sourcing steel products in a responsible and sustainable manner, while also ensuring that our suppliers meet our high standards of ethical and social responsibility. Our sourcing policy is guided by the following principles:

1. Compliance with laws and regulations:
We comply with all applicable laws and regulations related to responsible sourcing of steel products, including those related to conflict minerals.
